Dysfunctional families have been at the heart of American drama since Eugene O'Neill's LONG DAY'S JOURNEY INTO NIGHT exploded onto the New York stage in the late 1950s. There's a direct line from O'Neill through Arthur Miller. Tennessee Williams. Edward Albee to Tracey Letts' AUGUST: OSAGE COUNTY.

With OTHER DESERT CITIES, playwright Jon Robin Baitz adds a new twist to American family drama by including politics with the personal. The play is bookended by the Vietnam War and George W Bush's (Operation:



Shock and Awe) Irag invasion. The Wyeth family are estranged as much by politics as deeply buried family secrets, creating a story where political divides and emotional chasms make for intriguing and richly themed drama. Even the play's title (which refers to a highway sign outside of Palm Springs) also alludes to events in the Middle East (in other desert cities around the world), and the fear that permeates the home of Polly and Lyman Wyeth parallels the mood of America post 9/11.

It has been a great pleasure discovering OTHER DESERT CITIES with a cast of this calibre. My love and thanks to them for their sense of inquiry and great talent. Big thanks as well to my design team, Rachael Walker, Phillip Dexter, Lucy Jane Senior and Adrian Hollay, and to our sterling ATC production team.

SYNOPSIS

The play's name refers to a control city guide sign on eastbound Interstate 10 in California, which indicates that the freeway is headed towards Indio, California and "other Desert Cities" (that is, the rest of the Coachella Valley).

The play's events occur around the Christmas 2004 holiday, when the family of Polly and Lyman Wyeth gather in Palm Springs, California. Their daughter Brooke Wyeth returns home after six years. Polly's sister Silda is also living there, after a time spent in rehab. Polly and Lyman are Republicans, while Silda is a liberal. The sisters co-wrote a series of MGM comedies in the 1960s.

Brooke announces to her family that she is about to publish a memoir dredging up a pivotal and tragic event in the family's history — a wound they don't want reopened. That event is the suicide of her late brother Henry, who had been involved with the radical underground subculture.

2003 - 2004 Iraq Timeline

A timeline preceding the Christmas holiday in which the action of the play takes place, reveals controversy over the war in Iraq, including questionable intelligence sources, staged events, vast amounts of American dollars poured into the effort, and thousands of U.S. soldiers dying for a cause disputed on both sides of the aisle.

These conditions could be argued to have been much like those of the Vietnam War some thirty years before, and set the stage for tension and strife within the politically divergent Wyeth family.

March 19, 2003: Bush launches invasion of Iraq with "Operation: Shock and Awe."

- **April 1, 2003**: Private First Class Jessica Lynch recovered by U.S. forces. What the Pentagon framed as a heroic rescue was later revealed to have been staged.
- May 1, 2003: WMD rationale agreed on for bureaucratic reasons, "The truth is that, for reasons that have a lot to do with the U.S. government bureaucracy, we settled on the one issue that everyone could agree on which was weapons of mass destruction as the core reason [to go to war]." [Paul Wolfowitz, May, 2003]

May 29, 2003: Bush: "We found weapons of mass destruction."

- July 11, 2003: Condoleezza Rice: Admits doubts about Iraq intelligence were not communicated to Bush "All that I can tell you is that if there were doubts about the underlying intelligence in the NIE [National Intelligence Estimate], those doubts were not communicated to the President."
- **April 28, 2004**: Images of horrendous abuse and torture of Iraqi prisoners by Americans at Abu Ghraib are revealed.
- May 11, 2004: Video released showing Nicholas Berg, an American contractor, being beheaded by Iraqi militants.
- August 27, 2004: Bush acknowledged for the first time that he made a *"miscalculation of what the conditions would be"* in postwar Iraq [Reuters, 27 August, 2004]
- September 7, 2004: Death toll of U.S. soldiers in Iraq reaches 1,000.
- September 16, 2004: U.N. Secretary General Kofi Annan declares Iraq war illegal.
- October 7, 2004: Iraq did not have WMD. Saddam Hussein did not possess stockpiles of illicit weapons at the time of the U.S. invasion in March 2003 and had not begun any programme to produce them, a CIA report concludes.

Waterfront Theatre Project

With the recent exciting announcement of the \$1.5 million contribution from New Zealand Lottery's Significant Projects Fund, a home for Auckland Theatre Company is set to become a reality. Consequently, this month we undertook the important task of selecting a contractor to lead the construction of the Waterfront Theatre Project.

The Process

Four contractors were asked to submit tenders by 1 April with the guidelines that each bid would be assessed on factors such as approach, understanding, methodology, and company track record and reputation. These were handed to the Contractor Evaluation Panel, made up of nine of the project's stakeholders, designers and architects, for assessment.

We are happy to announce, following an extensive selection process, Hawkins Construction has been engaged as the preferred contractor to lead the build of the Waterfront Theatre Project. Hawkins has over six and half decades experience and has worked on projects such as the Auckland Museum Grand Atrium, Auckland Art Gallery and the Viaduct Events Centre and will be lead by Gary Walker, Hawkins Construction's Auckland Regional Manager.

Hawkins is now working closely with the project team to finalise the construction cost and other aspects of the project before the contract is let. Once it is determined there is sufficient funds secured to commence construction, a request will be submitted to Auckland Council to release their confirmed grant. This will lead to an official start date which is expected to be in the middle of the year.
