miranda harcourt



Miranda Harcourt is currently head of acting at Toi Whakaari: NZ Drama School. She has acted in most of New Zealand's theatres, played many screen roles and toured New Zealand and internationally, notably with *Verbatim* and *Flowers from My Mother's Garden* (commissioned for the 1998 New Zealand Festival)

She has won awards as a director for Best Short Film (Voiceover), Best Production (Much Ado About Nothing) and as Best Actress (A Doll's House). She is a graduate of Toi Whakaari and studied drama therapy in London as a Winston Churchill fellow before returning to New Zealand to work with the deaf, on self-devised projects and with prison inmates and victims of violence on stage and screen. Most recently Miranda has directed for Downstage, the NZ Festival, Auckland Theatre Company and Toi Whakaari, and has this year made a return to acting with major roles in Colin McColl's Top Girls at Downstage and in Stuart McKenzie's feature film. For Good, selected for the Montreal Film Festival along with Miranda's short film Needles and Glass (co-directed with Rawiri Paratene).

In 2002 Miranda was awarded an ONZM for services to Theatre and the Community.

CONCEPT AND PERFORMER

fiona samuel

Fiona Samuel trained at the New Zealand Drama School, graduating in 1980. Since then she has worked as an actor, writer and director in theatre, radio, television and film. She has travelled the country with two plays: Oracles and Miracles and Lashings of Whipped Cream - A Session with a Teenage Dominatrix, a solo show she wrote herself. Her most recent theatre work includes Dancing at Lughnasa, Social Climbers and Take a Chance on Me, all for Auckland Theatre Company. Fiona's first major written work for television was the drama series The Marching Girls; more recently she has written and directed Face Value - three monologues for women; Home Movie, voted best television drama of 1998, and her first documentary Virginity, which screened in 2001. She is currently developing several projects for television and film, and is in recent post-production with her daughter Queenie, born in March this year.

'I discovered Carol Ann Duffy on the northwestern motorway. I turned on my car radio and she was reading 'Mrs Midas' in a soft, flat, riveting voice that had me instantly spellbound. Listening to the interview that followed, I made it my mission to track down the book of poems she talked about — *The World's Wife*. I wolfed it down in one sitting and knew these poems had to be on stage. Many weeks, phone calls, faxes, emails and brainstorms later, here they are. Thanks to everyone who made the journey with me, and to the New Zealand Festival for backing us to the hilt and sharing our faith that a slim volume of poetry could make dazzling theatre.

I hope you will love these words as much as I do. They make the ancient art of poetry new all over again, and reveal strong, witty, tender and shocking female truths that have grabbed me and not let go.'

carol ann duffy

Carol Ann Duffy was born in Glasgow in 1955. Her poetry has received many awards, including the Whitbread and Forward Prizes for her 1993 *Mean Time* collection of poems. *The World's Wife* was shortlisted for the 1995 Forward and T S Eliot prizes. Duffy was awarded an OBE in 1995 and caused some controversy in 1999 when she and Andrew Motion were frontrunners to be British Poet Laureate. Motion's appointment was considered to be a safe and traditional one, whereas Duffy had raised concerns within the establishment because of her sexuality, her insistence that the position be thoroughly overhauled and her refusal to write poems for the Royal Family. Carol Ann's most recent release is a book of poems titled *Feminine Gospels* (Picador, 2002).



elizabeth mcrae

Elizabeth McRae is a distinguished actor with a long career on stage and screen. Her theatre work in the last decade includes Woman B in Albee's *Three Tall Women*, the grandmother in *Ricordi* for the 1996 New Zealand Festival, Marina in *Uncle Vanya*, Kath in Roger Hall's *Social Climbers*, Mammy in *The Cripple of Innishmaan*, and Ruth in *Collected Stories* (directed by Miranda Harcourt). Her film work includes *Return Journey*, *Death in the Family*, *The Secret*, *Jubilee* and *His Father's Shoes*. Elizabeth was in Fay Weldon's *Growing Rich* for Anglia TV. She played Thea in Fiona Samuel's *Home Movie* and was Marj Brasch in the first four years of *Shortland Street*.

rachel house PERFORMER

A Graduate of Toi Whakaari: the New Zealand Drama School, Rachel has worked on many theatre productions such as Nga Pou Wahine by Briar Grace Smith, Hone Kouka's Waiora, King Lear and Savage Hearts with Theatre at Large, By Degrees and The Bellbird with Auckland Theatre Company and Serial Killers, Wit and An Enemy of the People at Circa Theatre. She has also been a part of the Mataku series, The Life and Times of Te Tutu and the films, Whalerider and Crime Story. She has won three Chapman Tripp Theatre Critics awards including Most Outstanding Performance for Witi Ihimaera's Woman Far Walking and Director of the year for Mitch Tawhai Thomas' Have Car Will Travel.





don mcglashan
COMPOSER, ARRANGER AND MUSICIAN

Don McGlashan was a member of the percussion group From Scratch, the band Blam Blam Blam, and the theatre/music/film duo The Front Lawn. He recorded and performed with his band The Mutton Birds from 1991 to 2002, winning many awards and an international following. McGlashan has also written music for TV and film, including Jane Campion's An Angel at my Table, Sam Neill and Judy Rymer's Cinema of Unease, and the TV series Street Legal. He is currently writing songs for his first solo album.

david long MUSICIAN

David Long was a member of the Wellington band Six Volts in the late 1980s before forming The Mutton Birds with Don McGlashan. He has composed and performed music in many spheres, including series two of The Strip, dance scores for Douglas Wright and Shona McCullagh and, with Plan 9, Hobbit music and The Sound of the Ring for the three The Lord of the Rings movies. He has also produced albums for others and won Producer of the Year award for the Fur Patrol album Pet. A solo album, Come On In was released last year and a new album Acid and Alkaline with The Lab Coats will shortly be released.



paul o'brien LIGHTING DESIGNER

Paul O'Brien has worked as a lighting designer for New Zealand performance for the last 12 years. His most recent work includes: Flowers from My Mother's Garden, Blue Smoke, The Candlestick Maker, The Underwatermelon Man, and seasons with New Zealand percussion group, Strike.




andrew thomas DESIGNER

marilyn sainty COSTUME DESIGNER


Marilyn Sainty is a self-taught fashion designer who has been making clothes for more than 30 years. This is the first time she has designed for the theatre.
